## **GENESIS ENERGY, L.P. ANNOUNCES ALABAMA PIPELINE EXTENSION PROJECT**

August 7, 2007 (Houston, TX)– Genesis Energy, L.P. (AMEX:GEL) announced today that it has committed to build an extension from its existing Florida crude oil pipeline system to transport crude for producers operating in southern Alabama.

The new lateral will consist of approximately 33 miles of 8” pipeline originating in the Little Cedar Creek Field in Conecuh County, Alabama to a connection to Genesis’ Florida Pipeline System in Escambia County, Alabama. The project will also include gathering connections to approximately 30 wells and additional crude oil storage in the field. Genesis expects the cost of the project to be approximately \$11 million. Construction of the project is supported by an agreement with Midroc Operating Company, a leading developer of the Little Cedar Creek Field. The Project is expected to be placed in service in the first quarter of 2008.

Grant Sims, Chief Executive Officer of Genesis said, “We are pleased to announce this organic growth project to expand our operations around the Florida Pipeline. The Smackover formation, anchored by the development in the Little Cedar Creek Field, is a leading production play in southern Alabama. While we are currently gathering this production via trucks into our Florida pipeline, upon completion of this pipeline, we will be able to re-deploy such rolling assets into other areas. This project is a clear indicator of our commitment to develop solid organic growth opportunities for Genesis.”

Genesis Energy, L.P. is a diversified midstream energy master limited partnership headquartered in Houston, Texas. Genesis conducts its operations in four business segments. The Pipeline Transportation Division is engaged in the pipeline transportation of crude oil and, to a lesser extent, natural gas and carbon dioxide. The Refinery Services Division primarily processes sour gas streams to remove sulfur at refining operations. The Logistics and Supply Division is engaged in the transportation, storage and supply of energy products, including crude oil and refined products. The Industrial Gas Division produces and supplies industrial gases such as carbon dioxide and syngas. Genesis’ operations are primarily located in Texas, Louisiana, Arkansas, Mississippi, Alabama and Florida.
