## **GENESIS ENERGY, LP. REPORTS NO SIGNIFICANT IMPACT TO ITS OPERATIONS FROM RECENT HURRICANES**

Houston – September 17, 2008 – Genesis Energy, L.P. (AMEX:GEL) (“Genesis” or the “Partnership”) today reported no significant damage to its assets or significant impact on its operations resulting from the recent hurricanes, Gustav and Ike, which have affected the Gulf Coast states in recent weeks. While certain operations have experienced periods of disruptions and dislocations, primarily due to commercial power issues, no Partnership assets or the assets of any material customers have suffered any significant damage to the Partnership’s knowledge. The following discussion gives an update by segment for Genesis’ operations as of 5 p.m. CDT on September 16, 2008.

### **Pipelines:**

Florida/Alabama:	Normal operations
Mississippi:	Normal operations, fully recovered from commercial power disruptions caused by Gustav
Texas:	No apparent significant damage, shut-in as a result of Ike, awaiting restoration of commercial power and nominations from refinery customers
CO2 Pipelines:	Normal operations on both NEJD and Free State

### **Refinery Services:**

Westlake, LA:	Facility anticipated to resume normal operations from Ike by Thursday, September 18; experienced minor operational disruptions caused by Gustav
All others:	Normal operations

### **Supply & Logistics:**

Trucking:	Normal operations
Terminals:	Normal operations; except for Pt. Hudson awaiting restoration of commercial power after Gustav
Marine:	DG Marine, LLC (49% owned by Genesis) experienced no damage to its assets and minimal disruptions to its operations due primarily to waterway navigational issues caused by Gustav and Ike; took delivery of 4 newly constructed barges and initiated contract services to 2 new customers on September 15, 2008

### **Industrial Gases:**

CO2 sales:	Normal operations
Sandhill:	Normal operations

T&P Syngas: No apparent significant damage; awaiting restoration of commercial power after Ike

Grant Sims, Chief Executive Officer of Genesis, commented, “All in all, we are very pleased with how our operations have weathered the recent storms. While we have experienced a certain amount of disruptions and dislocations to our normal operations, we have no reason to expect any material long-term effects from Gustav and Ike on the Partnership’s financial performance.”

Joe Blount, President and Chief Operating Officer of Genesis, added, “We want to thank our dedicated employees, many of whom have been personally disrupted and dislocated, for their hard work over the last several weeks. With their help and Genesis’ dedication to safe, reliable, and responsible operations, we have been able, for the most part, to provide quality services to all of our customers in the face of otherwise challenging circumstances.”
